Ma made her first communion
at 12 years - wore a borrowed
veil - had no white shoes -
Did not want her picture taken.

is wearing a rose in her hair)

3/29/68 Katherine Duntach said Grandfather
Depend ran away from home -
(between Montreal + Quebec) when
he was 16 after riding a new
horse to death - never saw his
people again. Name is really
Cheput or something like that.
His brother owned a department
store by that name in Montreal.

Grandfather Joe Cheput (later
Americanized to Shepard) came from
France where he was born in Paris, to
Montreal - a farm on the outskirts -
with his parents - time & names unknown.

When he was 16, his parents went to
town - first warning him not to touch a
new horse they just bought. He rode
it anyway & it died - so he ran away.
Hid in bushes when he saw his parents
returning from Montreal.

Met & married Rachael Stewart
Winters from Buffalo - a widow with one
boy (Fritz (?) Winters) lived in Toronto, then
U.S. in Muskegon Mich. Had children:
Josephine Shepard Lord (who raised a boy
Frederick who was said to be the son of
her sister Mayme.

Mayme - died when her long hair
caught fire while standing
in front of a gas heater!

Edward - two children Marguerite & Eugene
Lillian
Beatrice -

Their mother died + the father gave
Lillian + Bea (your mother) to friends.
Fritz Winters was 17- married to
Lillie - 16- Tried to keep family
together but Lillie + Josie (same
age) didn't get along. They
kept + raised my father. Josie
went to N.Y. - child nurse -

Grandfather Jos. worked in woods in
Mich. & later in Two Harbors, Minn. I
met old men who claimed to have
known him. He lived with my mother
+ dad when Edward was a baby - was
around 98 yrs then. Josie took him
to Detroit, Mich. where he died, supposedly
about 102 yrs.
